What does the Bible really teach?

What do some teach?

Some teach that once a person has trusted in Christ, he can be certain of his eternal future, unconditionally and no matter what he says, does, believes, or disbelieves.

Others teach that once a person has trusted in Christ, he is not absolutely certain that his eternal future is certain, no matter what. It is commonly taught that by disbelief, or failure to believe enough, or do enough, or to do the right thing, or by doing the wrong thing, or ceasing to believe, or by some act of the “free will”, a person can remove himself from the eternal relationship with God he once thought he had. In other words a person can choose to lose eternal salvation, because a loving God would never force anyone to do anything against their own will. Salvation is conditional.

WHAT DOES THE BIBLE TEACH?

The Bible says clearly and in context, that there are over 50 benefits that God bestows on the believer at the moment he believes. All of these benefits are independent of human will and are presented by the Bible as a work and gift of the sovereign God. These acts of God are commonly called “positional truth”, because they are not necessarily experienced by the believer nor are they affected by anything the believer can do to obtain them. They are seen as a work of grace and love by a sovereign God, and are descriptions of a permanent “position” in Christ.

There are no references in the entire Bible, where God reverses or takes away any of the eternal and permanent “positional” benefits He gives to the believer at the moment of salvation. For salvation to be lost, God must undo the salvation package; all of it! But there is never any mention of any benefit being undone. Each benefit speaks of salvation. To undo just one is to undo all.



THE BENEFITS OF GOD

All of these benefits God gives to the believer are beyond reach. There is no Biblical record of either God or man undoing any of these benefits. Some conclude that one might then live a life of abandon with no consequences. Not so. Those in Christ have a new heart of belief and behavior, and God disciplines his own children to keep them in line and shows his love. Please see Heb. 12:4-12, 1 Cor. 12:27-31, Acts. 5:5-11, Jonah 2, IJn.5:16-17.

Rewards may be lost but never salvation. Please see 1Cor. 3:10-15.
